



Nevada Summer Electronic Benefit Transfer (S-EBT)

For School Year 2025-2026

Helping families access nutritious food while school is out for summer:



What is Summer EBT?

A federal program from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) helping eligible families buy groceries for school-aged kids during summer.

\$120 per eligible child on an EBT card (like a debit card).



Who Qualifies Automatically?

Children who attend a school that participates in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or School Breakfast Program (SBP) and get free or reduced-price meals through:

- SNAP, TANF, or Medicaid.
- An approved school meal application.
- A school determination that they are homeless, migrants, in foster care, or runaways.

Are 6-18 years old:

- Part of an active SNAP, TANF, or Medicaid case.
- Participate in the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations.
- Eligibility must occur during the '25-'26 school year to Aug. 9, 2026.

Program Reminders

- One-time benefit for 2025-2026 school year
- \$120 per eligible child
- Only used in the state where child completed school
- Misuse or duplicate benefits may result in payback

Families who do not meet the automatic eligibility rules must apply starting May 23, 2026 through *Access Nevada*: accessnevada.nv.gov
